



LABEL

ORCA

A toothed black-and-white whale found in the Pacific Northwest.



LOGGING

SALMON

Fish native to the Pacific Northwest. Common salmon types are steelhead, coho, chum, pink, and sockeye.



RAINIER

One of five volcanoes in the Pacific Northwest “Ring of Fire.”



NARROWS

SEAL

A device with a cut or raised figure that can be used to create a mark.



SPACE NEEDLE

A tower in Seattle that was built for the 1962 World’s Fair.



SYMBOL

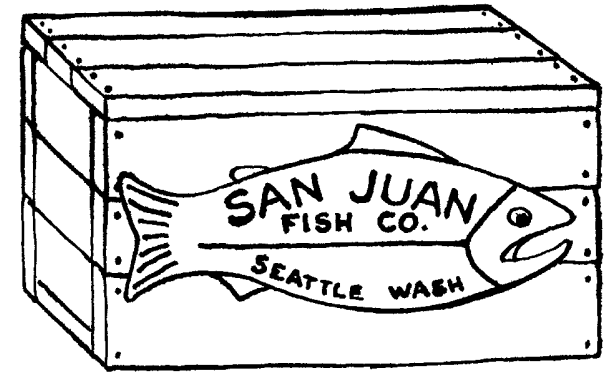
Something that stands for something else. A petroglyph is just one type of symbol.

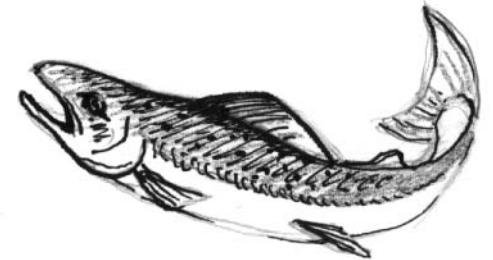

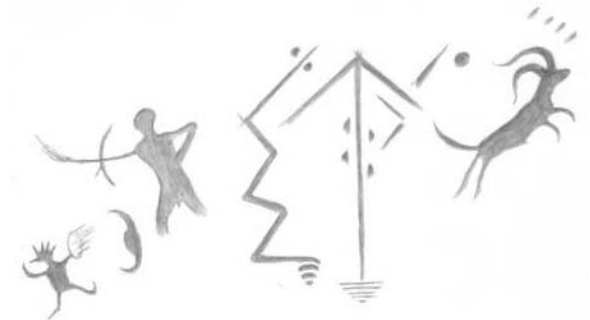
